## HOME REBUILDING QUARTERLY REPORT DEC 10- FEB 11

WE HAVE EMBARKED ON A NEW HOME REBUILDING PROGRAM CALLED “EACH ONE BUILD ONE”, HELPING TO REBUILD THE COMMUNITIES OF GRAND-GOAVE AND BENEFITING FAMILIES WHO WERE VICTIMS OF THE JAN 12, 2010 EARTHQUAKE



**Project Account Name:** “Each One Build One” Home Rebuilding

**Actual Date Started:** Nov 16, 2010 the first \$25,000 was wired to Haiti from HAM USA. The actual construction began Dec 1, 2010.

**Status:** The first 3 homes are near completion. Just doors remain to be installed. All 3 homes are parged, iron-reinforced block with concrete slab floors and roofs, containing 3 rooms & a porch and wired for electricity.

**Expected Date of Completion:** First 3 homes will be done by Feb 28, 2011.

**Summary of Activity:** The project was to start Oct 1, 2010, but due to complications with logistics and plans, construction began late. The first portion of funds was to build 5 homes, at \$5,000 each, but rather than following the plans to use pre-fabricated concrete panels, the first 3 homes were built using reinforced block. Materials cost more than originally budgeted, requiring an evaluation of work before more homes can be built. Each home has taken roughly 1 month to construct.

**Life Changing Story:** “I am very happy that my family was chosen to be the first recipient of a home. The house that we were living in before the earthquake was destroyed and we had to rent a room in town and at the end of the year of 2010, they had kicked us out. I am so grateful that I was able to find a little piece of land and that Haiti ARISE has been able to build this house for me and my 3 children. I cannot say how happy I am and how much I know that God will bless Haiti ARISE for the work that they are doing.”

“I cannot express how much I am happy. I feel like the heavens have opened before me and I have so much joy for what Haiti ARISE is doing for my family. I was working on a home for a long time and it was all lost in the earthquake. I know God would have provided for me to build again, but a home like this would have taken me 10-15 years.

“I have already gotten so many compliments from neighbors and friends in town who have come to see my new home and they are singing praises for Haiti ARISE. Many say that there is no organization in Haiti that is building such quality, solid homes, like Haiti ARISE is building. They congratulate Haiti ARISE, as well as all of the missionaries who have come and given so much heart to help build these homes. I am so grateful and I cannot say how much I thank you!”

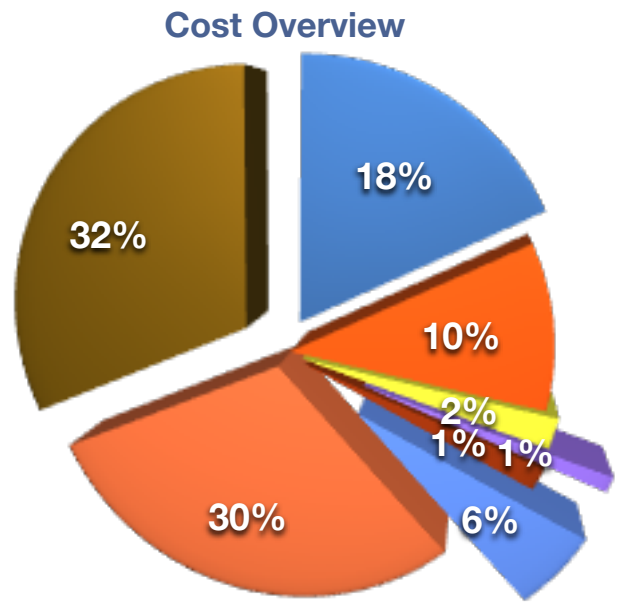
