Project Account Name: Medical Clinic

Actual Date Started: Funds of \$25,000 US wired & received Oct 14, 2010, project began the same day. The second \$25,000 US was wired on Nov 29, 2010. The last \$30,000 was wired May 10, 2011. This report is for the last \$30,000 only. Please see prior reports for the other funds mentioned above.

Status: Funds completed. Finishing touches left on the clinic, such as paint touch up, and furnishings. These remaining expenses will be covered by Haiti ARISE funds.

Expected Date of Completion: December 31, 2011

Summary of Activity: Since May 2011, the medical clinic has been in the finishing stages, including installation of windows, painting, plumbing and electrical installation, doors hung, cabinets built in each consultation room and septic tank and field dug.

Life Changing Story: "It has been exciting to be a part of what is happening here at Haiti ARISE, especially to see the medical clinic in the final stages of completion. My husband and I have been serving here as long-term missionaries. We had the privilege of hosting the medical team that came in the fall and can see how much impact the medical clinic will have once it is complete. In just two weeks the team saw 1,000 patients. I can only imagine how many lives will be impacted by having access to ongoing health care in their community."

Each consultation room door opens to the center waiting area between the two buildings.



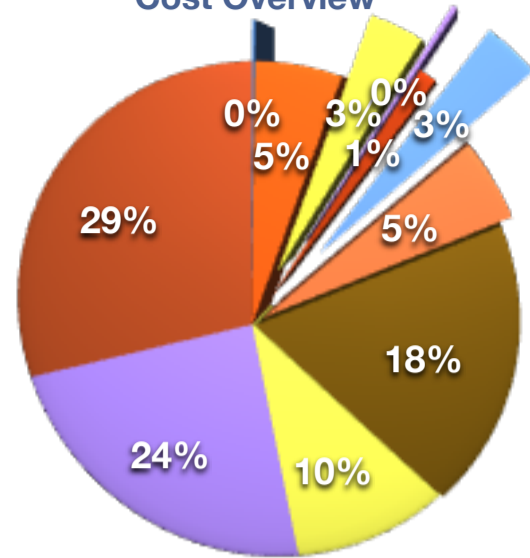
Every consultation room has a sink and cabinet. The pharmacy room has shelving around the whole perimeter with a desk in front of the window to serve patients.

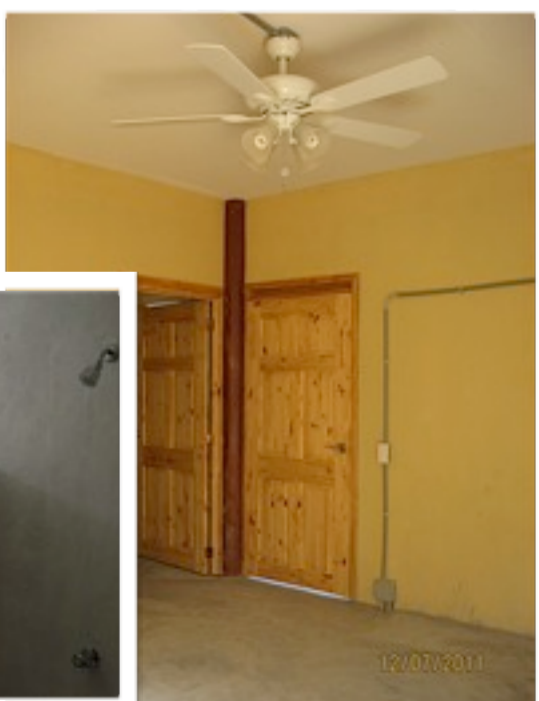
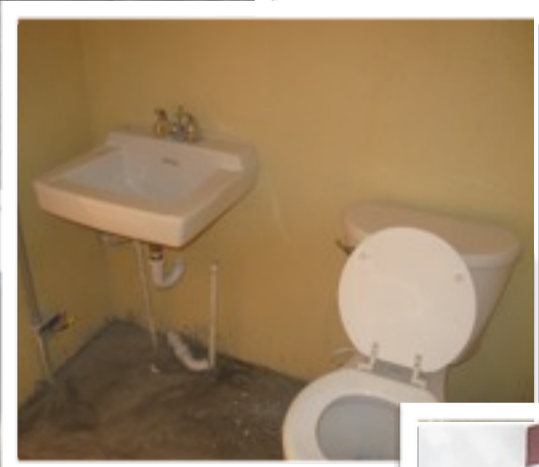
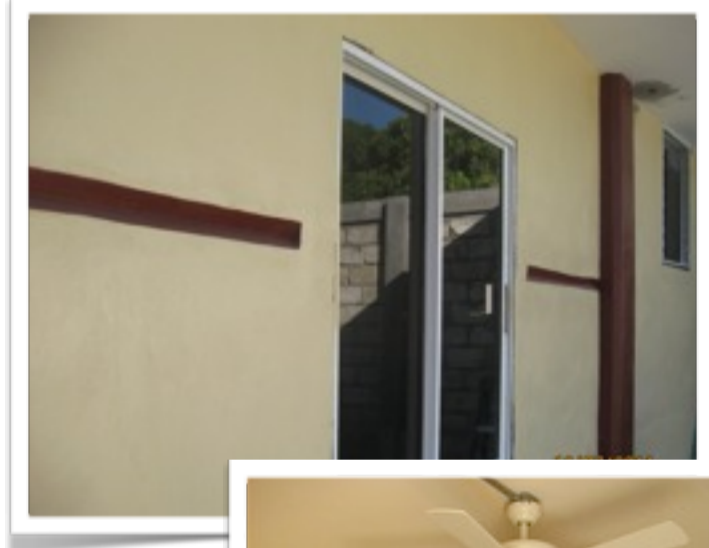

Septic field and tank for plumbing were installed to serve six bathrooms, 2 shower rooms, and sinks in each consultation room. Glass sliding windows, fans and lights are installed.
