

Central to the heart of our ministry is the hope of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Mahanaim Church is our first & central church established on the main campus of Haiti ARISE in Grand-Goave.

Haiti ARISE has grown to encompass 10 church plants in communities throughout Haiti. Our most recent Mahanaim Church in the southern town of Jeantiot just celebrated it's 1st anniversary with over 150 members.

As we strive to build relationships with leaders and pastors throughout Haiti through conferences that hosts up to 300 leaders annually, we have also established Haiti Ministers Fellowship, where 40 plus likeminded pastors connect regularly to grow together in ministry.

BUILDING CAMPAIGN

Our founder's heart is to see the permanent church building built on Haiti ARISE's south campus. Launched in 2020, our 'Enlarging the Tent Pegs' Mahanaim Church Building Campaign is well underway and we will be breaking ground next year on the new building.



Education

Outside of food and shelter, EDUCATION is the single most important need for the children and youth of Haiti. Over 400,000 children are orphaned and 1 out of 5 will not make it to their 6th birthday. 10 percent of all Haitian children are child slaves, and 50% will never be afforded the opportunity to attend school.

Quality education has been tremendously difficult for the Haitian people. Prior to Covid, nearly half a million school-age children had little or no access to this precious resource. And now, the pandemic combined with political unrest has kept nearly 70 percent of all Haitian children from attending class throughout the school year. Recent and past events including earthquakes and hurricanes have only complicated the delivery of consistent, quality education.

Haiti ARISE has taken great steps to help fill the gap and lead the way, and because of this extraordinary initiative, Primary and Secondary schools are thriving. The 'Renewal of Haiti Academy' currently provides an opportunity for over 600 children in pre-school to grade 10, receive an education. Phase 1 of our school construction plans brought the completion of the permanent elementary school building in 2016 housing 12 classrooms. Phase 2 has ushered in 2019-2020 the washrooms building, as well as a cafeteria & admin building for offices. Phase 3 started 2020 with the high school building with another 12 classrooms & library. One building remains to complete the schools' facilities for a designated middle school.

Our Education program provides children and youth the opportunity to attend school, to learn and become self sufficient, empowering them to make a tremendous difference in their own communities.

Our goals are BIG. Education is KEY. At Haiti ARISE we are equipping future generations with the tools they need to go into the world and make lasting change.

Technical School

The Technical & Professional School exists to provide quality and practical education and hands-on training in skilled trades and technical studies. Classes are taught by qualified & trained Haitian teachers as well as international volunteer teachers. Recognized by the Haitian government, the school is able to offer degrees, diplomas and certificates in studies enduring from 1 year to 3 years.



Health Center

Our on-site Medical Clinic, 'Zanmitay Sant de Sante' (Friends Helping Friends Health Center) operates 3 days a week helping to meet the basic needs of health care and disease prevention in our community.

The facility includes exam rooms, dental room, pharmacy, laboratory, staff office, reception area, bathrooms and public showers. The clinic sees over 9,000 patients each year with most patients coming from the local community and all over the countryside.

The clinic regularily does community outreach as well as mobile clinics, health seminars and patient follow-up care with home visits.

Your support of the clinic enables us to continue to offer our communities health care, and meet our budget of **\$2,500/monthly**.

Birthing Center

Haiti has the highest maternal/newborn mortality rate in the western hemisphere. 75% of Haitian women deliver their babies without a skilled birth attendant (accredited midwives, nurse-midwives, doctors and nurses with midwifery skills and specialist obstetricians) which explains why 359 Haitian women die in every 100,000 births, a 50x the mortality rate compared to only 7 in 100,000 in Canada. The leading causes of maternal death are hemorrhage, obstructed labor, infection, complications from abortion and preeclampsia. This isn't surprising given the population of 10 million with only 100 obstetricians and 201 nurse midwives to meet those needs. Access to these skilled birth attendants is complicated further by the reality of poverty, geography, and poor quality of comprehensive obstetric care.

Midwives save lives, ensuring the family unit remains intact, as mothers are guided through birth and into parenthood.

Our vision to is provide a safe and home-like birthing environment with qualified midwives to ensure healthy mamas have healthy babies. We provide prenatal, birthing & postnatal care and education.

We don't know all the reasons why a woman delivered her baby and died on the streets of Grand Goave, after being turned away from the hospital – was it a lack of funds? A lack of recognizing a serious condition? A lack of medication? We also don't know the reasons why a newborn found in an outhouse and brought to Haiti Arise, subsequently died in the hospital. But these tragedies have galvanized Haiti ARISE to try to provide a safe option for laboring women and their newborns.

Our fundraising goal to fully open the Birthing Center for operations is **\$40,000/year.**















Disaster after Disaster, Haiti has faced it all. And through it all Haiti ARISE has been there. For over 20 years we have been there to support the people of Haiti because disaster relief is a part of our fabric.

We are actively involved in providing immediate relief in the form of food, water and medical supplies. But more than that Haiti Arise has long term rebuilding efforts that are focused on creating lasting change.

Haiti Arise has skilled Haitian labourers and tradespeople that lead our efforts on the ground to bring Haiti back. Some of our projects include building new modest homes that provide Haitians with shelter, safety and protection from the elements.

After the historically devastating 2010 earthquake killed 300,000 & destroyed 1/2 million homes, Haiti ARISE took on a program called EachONE BuildONE to partner with communities in home rebuilding and completed the construction and repair of over 125 homes. Just 6 years later, when Hurricane Matthew ripped through the south levelling 80% of the towns, we constructed 195 Hurricane Homes from Cavaillion to Jeremie. Then most recently in 2021 Hurricane Grace that followed on the heels of another shocking earthquake pummelled the south again. We have again taken up the cause to build **200 homes**, being the hands and feet of Jesus to families that have lost everything.

One in every ten children in Haiti are "restaveks", a Creole term that means "to stay with", but in reality is a child slave. Parents give their children away in hopes that they will receive better care than they can afford to provide them. But this rarely happens. There are also many children throughout Haiti that are abandoned or orphaned due to the abject poverty and crisis of teen and unwed pregnancies.

Our heart is to rescue these children and bring them into a loving family environment and a place of safety, where they will be cared for in a family unit, have access to education, spiritual upbringing and good nutrition. Our Children's Village homes house up to eight kids plus house parents.

The ARISE Children's Village opened in January 2016. Each home operates as a family unit rather than an orphanage. A social worker oversees the children's development and conducts parent interviews and training.

Three of the six complexes are now complete. Once all the homes are built we will have 18 units that will house up to 144 children. Each house parent has employment within Haiti ARISE, or in their own outside business or work. They earn their own salary to help support their family unit. Haiti ARISE provides an allotment per family to help cover the costs of food, clothing, propane, gas. The parents are required to budget, meal plan, and provide receipts for their allotment each month. This will ensure the children are being well looked after, while still providing the parents with the dignity of caring for their own family.

25 children now call Arise Children's Village home, but even more important they now have a family.

Would you be willing to help raise up this village? Monthly sponsorship of **\$60.00** is allocated towards the child's family unit. Dollars go directly to the operation of the home. Children's Village Sponsorship helps to pay for the child's food, clothing, toiletries, health care needs, and for school-age children...tuition, uniform, books and supplies. Multiple sponsors are required for each child. If you're interested in giving a lump sum donation, those dollars are allocated to the CV general fund toward future growth and development of the ARISE Children's Village.

Our goal is to open another family home this year and need to raise **\$2,400** a month or gain **40** new sponsors @ **\$60** month.

MEET CARLY

Carly was our very first child that came to live at the village when we started. His mother died in childbirth, leaving 8 children behind with their father. His father was unable to care for any of them and gave up care for all of them to different people. Carly was in the care of his aunt. But she was not able to provide even milk for him and he was near to death when we found him. In getting him immediate medical attention, more than 70 worms were expelled from his little body! He was 14 months old and was unable to hold up his head, let alone his body.

But look at him now!



Through our "Kids 4 Kids" after school program we provide education on goat management to elementary school students. Students are given a pregnant goat after a 12-week course. Future goat offspring from the goats our students receive can be used to provide funds for their schooling, or in turn to help provide for their families. The students are required to return the first offspring to the farm for the ongoing growth of the program. This year we gave 51 goats to kids and employed 8 workers to run the goat farm & agricultural programs.

Feed the hungry, help those who are destitute...As a part of a community outreach and to fulfill our calling to help care for the poor, Haiti ARISE is engaged in providing rice and food disributions in Grand-Goave, Tapion and Petit Goave as well as to our partner churches & their communities throughout Haiti.

This program serves as a tool to draw the community in and provides us with the oppotunity to share the gospel as well as other short educational teachings. It also gives us the opportunity to visit those in hospitals and prisons and help provide for the needs of widows. Through monthly support of **\$60-\$100**, you can help provide a regular meal pack for a widow.



Judicial Assistance

A few years ago, a young man from our church got himself into trouble doing something that is just typical teenage folly, but that unfortunately landed him in prison. He was held for one month in the Petit Goâve prison, along with 70 other men sharing his cell where hygiene, food and sanitation were non-existent. Our church members visited often, which spurred in us to begin a prison ministry to visit the prisoners, bring them food, clothing and share songs and the Scriptures with them. This ministry has been very impacting. In one of our visits, it became clear that God was calling us to do more.

Often times, prisoners in Haiti are not hard criminals, but rather have landed there for petty crimes such as stealing a piece of bread or getting into a fight with a neighbour. But because of the lack of justice, many of them, even when wrongfully accused, end up spending long periods of time with little hope of release in prison.

The Haiti ARISE Justice Assistance Office opened in April 2016 with the goal of providing legal representation for prisoners of petty crimes, giving them the opportunity to present their cases before a judge and stand trial for their judgement in a timely manner. We employ 5 lawyers in our office that visit the prisons daily to learn the stories and research cases of the prisoners. In the first year we were able to assist 87 prisoners, bringing 75 of them to freedom.






